A prayer for Peace...

A little while ago I went to both the new and old Coventry Cathedrals that sit side by side.

I admit that Cathedrals don't tend to inspire me to worship: they seem too grand and remote however wonderful the architecture might be. The Coventry Cathedrals were quite different, both the new and the old. As I expect many of you may know, the old Cathedral was blown to bits in WW2 but rather than flatten it entirely it was decided to leave the ruins standing and to turn them into a centre for peace.

This month we will be celebrating the birth of Jesus, the Prince of Peace, so I thought it appropriate to share a prayer that I found in the old Cathedral, written by an organisation called Pax Christi - The Peace of Christ.

Dear God

We thank you for giving us your peace.

Help us to spread peace at home and at school by loving and caring for one another.

Help us to spread peace by listening to one another, even when we don't agree.

Help us to spread peace by sharing our time with those who are lonely and who need a friend.

Help us to spread peace by thinking and praying for children who have no food or who are frightened and live in fear.

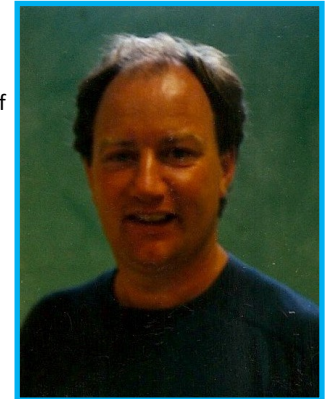
Everyday missionaries

Soaking our many outreach activities in prayer

There are two Youth Cafés, Basement Café for year 7-9 and Attic Café for Years 10-12. They take place on a Thursday and Friday evening. They are open to all and are places where the young people of the town meet Church. Many of those young people simply want a place where they can be safe, enjoy themselves and be loved; some have very specific needs and are on the margins.

This month’s Local & UK Mission Partner : Streetspace (Dan Potter)

Soaking our many outreach activities in prayer

We are thankful that the good work supporting young people in our community continues. We acknowledge the presence of Holy Spirit with us in the street-based ‘detached’ work, which has restarted with new volunteers after a break – the police speak favourably about this and anecdotally point to reduced levels of anti-social behaviour over the last few years. We hope that this work will pick up quickly to re-gain a good level of relationships. The users’ group from the local skate park are excited to be beginning fundraising for their proposed design for an extension. This is a significant stage for the group and I’m praying that the young people will feel empowered, valued and listened to throughout this work.

Please pray

- for the wisdom needed in which mentoring referrals to accept from the local secondary schools, as well as which adult mentors to pair them with; **giving thanks** for a place of influence in the lives of many; **asking** for peace and reconciliation for the young people with particularly difficult or chaotic home situations, and for clarity for the mentors in how we can best support them.
- for a continued sense of God’s provision and leading in direction of the work. South Glos are currently proposing to cut even more funds supporting young people. Others groups will also be majorly impacted if this goes ahead. You can give feedback on the proposal by searching online for *“South Glos positive activities proposal”*.
