Reaching out to God for a deeper awareness of his life in us When we pray for renewal, what are we praying for? Isaiah 35 gives us a tremendous picture of life bursting out of barrenness. Here's a snippet:

5 Then will the eves of the blind be opened and the ears of the deaf unstopped. 6 Then will the lame leap like a deer. and the mute tongue shout for joy. Water will gush forth in the wilderness and streams in the desert. 7 The burning sand will become a pool. the thirsty ground bubbling springs... 8 And a highway will be there; it will be called the Way of Holiness; it will be for those who walk on that Way.

Find Isaiah 35 in your Bible: read it all through and use it as the basis for your prayers for renewal this month.

SALVATION

Praying for those we long to see come to faith

'You will be my witnesses'. These words of Jesus were part of our first Sunday sermon on the book of Acts. A witness is someone who gives an honest account of their experience and knowledge of Jesus. Wouldn't it be great if in 2017, we all moved forwards in our power to witness for Jesus?

Prav to be a witness:

Look in: what inside of you stops you sharing Jesus? Fear of rejection? Embarrassment? Talk to God about these things. Ask for his healing, help and strength to overcome them.

Look up: the power to be a witness actually comes from God (Acts 1:8). Develop the habit of asking for a greater infilling of the Spirit specifically so that you may be a more powerful witness.

Look out: who are the people on your frontline with whom you would most like to share your faith? Pray for them regularly by name.



EDITOR IAL.

"Lay down your burdens and pick up your cross - you can't manage to carry both".

This interesting thought was shared in our Prayer Week. Burdens feel like they come from outside of us: the state of the world, the lives of our children (or elderly parents), the money in the bank (or lack of it), the need for a new job etc. However, what makes these external burdens feel unbearable is our internal reaction to them. Typically they cause us to fear loss: loss of reputation, loss of control, loss of spending power, loss of future dreams. It is fear that is the burden we cannot carry, not the circumstance itself.

In contrast, our cross is about a choice to walk with Jesus, trusting him with every step of the journey. The cross says, 'I'm out of answers, so I'm giving myself totally to you Jesus'. The cross is about deep trusting faith.

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That's why we can't carry the burdens of our fears, whilst also carrying the cross of our faith. Fear is corrosive to faith, and faith is the antidote to fear.

So: what will you carry this year? Burden or cross? Fear or faith? You can't carry both.

The Church is suffering and in huge need in many places in the world. ELAM supports, trains and prays for Christians in Iran and amongst Farsi speaking people.

Many Christians in Iran are paying a high price for their faith in Jesus. They have lost jobs, homes or even custody of children. Some have been physically abused. Scores are rejected by friends and family. And some are unjustly detained in Iran's notorious prison system. Your prayers are vital. Prayer strengthens our brothers and sisters and reminds them that they are not forgotten.

Please consider standing in solidarity and love through prayer with the prisoners listed below. They have all been imprisoned on false political charges relating to their Christian faith; usually they are convicted of 'undermining national security' through attending or organising house church meetings, or sharing their faith.

Christians serving court-issued sentences:

Maryam (Nasim) Naghash Zargaran (f)- house church member, in Evin prison since 15 July 2013. Serving 4 years Ebrahim Firouzi (m) - house church member, in Evin prison since August 2013. Serving a one year sentence, to be followed by two years exile to a border town. In March 2015 he was sentenced to a further five years.

- Behnam Irani (m) house church leader (Church of Iran denomination), in Ghezel Hesar prison, Karaj, since May 2011. Serving a six year sentence. In September 2014 he was given a further six year sentence; this was overturned at appeal on 9 December 2014.
- Vruir Avanessian (m) currently under house arrest. Ordained pastor of Armenian ethnicty, arrested at Christmas 2012; released after a few weeks on bail then tried and sentenced to 3.5 years in December 2013.
