This month's Local & UK Mission Partner : One25

Soaking our many outreach activities in prayer

One25 was founded 20 years ago to reach out to women in central Bristol involved in, or vulnerable to, street sex work. The aim is to "support women to break free and build new lives away from violence, poverty and addiction", by living out Jesus' proclamation to "set the captives free". Volunteer and paid workers need patience, grace and resilience to provide support such as healthcare, showers and clean clothing, food, safe space, advocacy, unconditional love and respect. 55 women were helped in this way last year.

Pray:

- * For workers to have strength, hope and inspiration from the Holy Spirit
- * For women to have protection, hope, courage, and to come to know Jesus
- * For protection from violence and injustice; for a vision for the future; and for the ongoing provision of resources

This month's World Mission Partner: Jews for Jesus

Touching the world through praying for our wider mission links and for the persecuted Church

Stephen Pacht, based in Geneva, is a full-time missionary for Jews for Jesus, an organisation of Messianic Jews who tell fellow Jews God's message of salvation and that Jesus is the Messiah. They work in more than 20 countries witnessing to Jews and non-Jews through evangelistic outreach and one-to-one contact.

Pray:

- * That all those visiting their new shop in Hendon will come to know Jesus as their saviour
- * For the salvation of A, a very orthodox Rabbi drawn to new age thinking; S, a Jewish lawyer and financier who is a humanist; B, a Moroccan-born Jewess drawn to Jesus and Kabbalah; A, a British-born lady married to a German gentile; The members of the former Jewish Circle
- * For Stephen's family: for his wife Deborah balancing a number of commitments; for his eldest children and his mother, that they will turn to Christ; for his younger daughters struggling with language differences between church and school
- * For God's direction for the future: whether Stephen should expand the work to German-speaking Switzerland or to southern France.
