

It is very challenging to develop a good habit of prayer. These three tips come from Brother Luigi Gioia. They are: keep it simple, keep it honest and keep it going. This is what he says:

Keep it simple.

Keep your prayer as simple as possible, maybe even reduce it to one sentence. To pray can be for five minutes, for fifteen minutes, or half an hour.

Keep it honest.

We often think that we have to be in a certain mood to pray. Before we pray we have to be peaceful or we have to be joyful or enthusiastic about the Lord. The reality is that we are in completely different moods. The secret is to realise that each one of these feelings, even the most negative feelings can be become a fuel for prayer. When I start praying I start with the most dominant feeling in my heart. Start from where you are.

Keep it going.

We can pray all the time, for the people around us. Or we can simply say Lord I love you, Lord help me. In any situation, we can pray. Keep it simple, keep it honest, keep it going.

World Events

Use the news as a source of prayer pointers. Pray for:

- Those grieving and suffering following the Manchester bombing.
- Peace and restraint in the world's trouble spots, especially Syria, North Korea and Iraq.
- The unrest in Brazil, caused by President Temer's alleged corruption
- The violence in the Philippines, in which Christians have been taken hostage.
- De-escalation in the tension with North Korea.

Please pray for:

- A sovereign move of God's Spirit in this area, drawing people to Jesus as Saviour and Lord.
- Specific individuals on your frontline.
- Your neighbours by name.
- Those attending Coffee Shop and our community outreach events.

Local Mission Partners

Thornbury Foodbank (TFB) started here at Thornbury Baptist Church in June 2013 and is a Thornbury Churches Together initiative, although not all volunteers are church goers. TFB is an affiliate of the Trussell Trust network of Foodbanks and a satellite of Yate Foodbank.

TFB is open every Friday from 2-4pm. Clients come to us for various reasons – low income, benefit delays/changes, illness or unexpected change of circumstance. Numbers of vouchers satisfied are increasing.
