### EDITORIAL

A collector walked into an antique shop and noticed a beautiful piece of glassware under a sign that said "unbreakable". The collector asked the dealer for a price and was told £100,000. **The collector** gasped and asked how the dealer could set such a high price. "Because it is unbreakable" said the dealer. Despite the price the collector bought the piece because they liked it so much, took it home, put it in a protective case, surrounded it with laser controlled alarms and invited their friends to come and see it. A few weeks later they went back to the dealer and explained how much care they had taken and how everyone loved the glassware. During the conversation they noticed another piece in the same place marked up as £100,000. The collector challenged the dealer because on the last visit they had seen that the price was £500. The dealer said that £100,000 was the new price because anyone willing to pay that much money for it was going to take as much care over it as the collector had done with the glassware that they had bought. When we know that something is extremely valuable we tend to take very great care of it. We have each been "bought with a price" (1 Corinthians 6:20). God paid a great price for each one of us; for that reason every person we meet is of great value, because they are of great value to God.
