# Each month we pray for an individual and for all those who share the same area of life and work. Their Frontline!

My name is Carol Fahy. When I joined a doctors' surgery as a receptionist in 2008 a colleague told me we were like swans floating calmly along on the water but underneath paddling like crazy. She was not wrong and I found the role a great challenge.

Now I am a healthcare assistant and have had to learn new skills. At first I was very nervous but having given my life to Jesus in 2011 I found that praying really helped overcome this and I became more and more aware that God was listening. I have always felt very supported by surgery staff in my role (which includes taking blood, wound care, blood pressure monitoring, supporting patients to quit smoking, and giving flu vaccinations), but most of all it is God



who gives me strength. Taking exams has been my worst nightmare but I've tried to stay focused on God's word: "Trust in the Lord completely and don't depend on your own knowledge. With every step think about what the Lord wants and he will help you go the right way" Proverbs 3:5-6 Easy-to-Read Version.

My patients come from all age groups, walks of life and have many different needs. It's a privilege talking to someone who may be very ill, recently bereaved, struggling with addiction or depression.

New Start Debt Advice (NSDA) is a community initiative maintained by Thornbury Churches Together (TCT). NSDA provides free, confidential, advice in Thornbury.

It is affiliated to Community Money Advice (CMA), a Christian charity, which provides a framework of policies, standards and procedures regulated by the Financial Conduct Authority under which NSDA works. CMA also provides training and support to NSDA.

Clients drawn from the local community receive a service that takes account of individual needs. Many clients are referred to NSDA through links with another TCT initiative, the Foodbank.

NSDA has ten trained advisers and one being trained. These volunteers give freely of their time and expertise.
