I've recently been reading a small classic on prayer, called The Meaning of Prayer, by Florence Fosdick. It was published in 1915, and the language is now a bit archaic, but the insights on prayer are still sharp, relevant and transformative.

In a chapter on 'Hindrances and Difficulties' (which haven't changed much in the past century by the way!), Fosdick points out how important it is to remember that *God is seeking us*.

It's not that in prayer we are blundering around trying to find him, but in prayer we discover the *God who is seeking us.* "According to our attitude in prayer", she writes, "the shepherd is lost and the sheep have gone out onto the tempest-driven mountainside to hunt for him"!

When we come to pray the first and "deepest necessity of a fruitful life of prayer is the recognition that God's search for us is prior to any of our search for him".

"Prayer is not groping after him", she writes. "Prayer is opening up our life to him. Finding God is really letting God 'find' us: for our search for him is really a surrender to his search for us. When the truth of this is clearly seen, prayer becomes real."

Make time this month to sink into the presence of the arms of the loving God who is seeking you out.

World Events

Use the news as a source of prayer pointers. Pray for:

- women in India where nearly 63 million women are "missing" due to foeticide, disease, neglect, or inadequate nutrition, a government survey says. More than two million women disappear every year and the phenomenon of "son preference" among Indians has created an estimated 21 million "unwanted" girls.
- the city of Cape Town, where if no rain comes the taps will run dry in April.
- the situation in Haiti, eight years on from the earthquake, where poor residents still cannot access clean drinking water.

Personal Renewal

Bitterness and unforgiveness are major obstacles to personal renewal. Here's a prayer from St Anselm that asks for renewal and the ability to bless our enemies:

O Merciful God, fill my heart, I pray, with the grace of your Holy Spirit: with love, joy, peace, long-suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance. Teach me to love those who hate me; to pray for those who despitefully use me, that I may truly be the child of my Father who makes the sun to shine on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the iust and the unjust.

- Over 3,000 Christians have been killed for their faith in the 2018 reporting period, more than twice as many as in the previous reporting period.
- Each of the top 11 World Watch List countries are now classed as places of extreme persecution – this is more countries than ever before in 26 years of the World Watch List.
- Libya has returned to the top ten
- Eritrea has moved up from ten to six.
- India has risen from 15 to 11.
- Egypt has moved from 21 to 17.

- those organisations, such as open Doors, Barnabas Fund, Christian Solidarity and Release International. Visit their websites for more prayer points for persecuted Christians worldwide.
