Over recent months we have been thinking a lot about sharing our faith with others. One of the most important practices that fuels faith-sharing is prayer. We see this in the life of Jesus who routinely spent time away in prayer, a practice that had an immediate impact on life on his 'frontline' (see Mark 1: 35 – 39).

Pete Greig talks about the connection between prayer and faith-sharing in his helpful book Dirty Glory:

"We are called to incarnate the presence of God, in streets, in hospitals, in schools and so on.

God's objective is not that we pray in some kind of transactional way, and then get on with our days, but that our very living and breathing is an inbreaking of the kingdom, is an act of emancipation to those who are oppressed, is an act of sharing the gospel of Jesus with those who need good news.

So then we have to ask 'How on earth do we live like that?' I think one of the keys to that is we re-centre on God's presence. We receive the Spirit of God afresh on a regular basis so that we leak his presence everywhere we go."

Frontline Mission - Working in Finance

After the collection is taken in an Anglican service, the prayer of thanksgiving that is used quotes the prayer of King David: 'All things come from you and of your own do we give you'. For all of us, and especially for those of us who work in finance, that is a vitally important perspective. Whilst St Paul says 'the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil', it is equally clear that we are expected to be good stewards of the money we have been entrusted with.

Christians who work in finance have a range of roles – for example, helping people make sure they have the money they need to support their retirement, making sure people have financial provision for ill health or bereavement or perhaps making sure that proper accounts are

kept and there is probity in the use of other people's money.

- All parents in the area, who have a very difficult and demanding role.
- Wisdom about the way forward, particularly with Parent Buddies, our one-to-one support service for parents. While there is much enthusiasm for the concept we have very limited take-up for the service (as other similar agencies also find).
- Those parents who have completed or nearly completed Parentalk the Teenage Years, that they will have a greater confidence in their parenting skills. This is a Care for the Family course, interspersed with guest speakers on topics such as social media, sex and relationships, and drugs and alcohol use.
- Good co-operative working with other agencies in the area.
- The right decisions about other parenting courses we could offer.

Mission Partners

Paz y Libertad is a home for some of the 20,000 street children of Cali, Colombia. We as a church have helped them to improve their building and they now have been able to rescue another 6 children from the streets. Pastor Fredy Botero runs this home, where there are about 16 - 18 children in the home and five now going to University.

Please pray for the Pastor (he also runs a large church) for strength, wisdom and for the ongoing help that he needs to run the home.

Pray for our sponsored children at the Amigos & Hermanos Fundacion all who are high risk children, again from very poor families. There are many diversions for all the children, many of the families having had little education, drugs are a big issue and there is a strong need for guidance.

Pray for the couple and the helpers who are involved in the Little English Church School where a couple from YWAM are very active and there are about 50 children from 5 - 10 years attending the school.

All these projects have Christianity as their main focus. Included in their daily sessions are singing Christian songs, a bible input and prayers.

Pray the Lord will open the hearts of all these children and protect them

from the dangers around them.
