Local / UK Mission

Myrtle Lawrence writes:

I started doing some outreach work three years ago in Bedminster. which has now grown into a different type of ministry. I co-lead the team of Bristol Healing Rooms, and this has morphed, together with street outreach work in Bedminster and Stokes Croft. to become a more widely spread connected Kingdom expression, 'Church Without Walls'. Returning prodigals, those who've been healed through BHRs, those who don't 'fit in' anywhere easily (exaddicts etc), new converts, and BHR's related team have connected up, and we've now got two healing home groups, a regular gathering for related teaching ministry, and a creative worship slot. People connect from churches. or none. Music, healing and deliverance are the main features.

I've been busy this past month, praying online with virus sufferers, (all healed thank God), pastoring those with mental health issues (two joined from rooms in hospital, one not a Christian yet), supporting South Bristol shut-ins with food parcels and contact (through locals), and creating/sending music videos to vulnerable people. We have no funds of our own, only what people can afford to give as gifts sometimes. So thank you all very much. Prayers and finance SO appreciated.

World Mission

Colombia has been on lock down for several weeks. In Hormiguero, where CaliKids have a number of sponsored children, many are ignoring the advice given about social distancing etc. and are actually socialising in the streets. There are very many cases of extreme poverty in Colombia and street sellers who barely survive in normal times, are now unable to go on the streets: it is very possible that many of these people will actually starve.

Please pray for:

- Wilson & Daniela, a YWAM couple, who moved to Hormiguero with their children to help these needy children. Pray for their safety and health in this very difficult environment. Pray for God's protection.
- Pray for Pastor Fredy who has an orphanage with about 25 children mainly from the streets. Fortunately the home is in the mountains which should give them a degree of safety.
- Please pray for Lisbeth at the Fundacion Amigos y Hermanos. It is very difficult to keep in touch with many of the children and the families at this time.
- Pray for God's protection over them all. Pray they will be able to get food supplies and for the health of them all.
