1 Samuel 1:1-20 Small group discussion notes:

As all small groups are meeting on Zoom at the moment, and as therefore meetings are time-limited, these discussion notes are being kept brief!

Verses 1-8

- 1. What do we learn about the three main characters in this story: Elkanah; Hannah; Peninnah?
 - a. How would you describe each one?
 - b. How 'true to life' do you find their story?
- 2. What are the causes of Hannah's unhappiness? How is her state described in verse 10? (Different translations use different words to describe her distress).

Verses 9-17

- 3. Hannah translates her bitterness into prayer.
 - a. Why do you think she was able to do this? What does this tell us of Hannah's relationship with God?
 - b. What other effects can bitterness and disappointment have on our relationship with God?
 - c. What advice would you give to a young Christian who is feeling deeply disappointed and/or being bullied by others, in the way that Hannah was?
- 4. How would you describe the character of Hannah's prayer? What does this tell us about prayer and also about God?
- 5. What one thing are you taking away from this opening section of 1 Samuel?
