TBC's Frontline Missionaries - Voluntary Roles

Hi my name is Dave. My wife Viv and I have been part of TBC for over 40 years. We have three children Andrew, Caroline and

Jonathon - all married. We also have five lovely grandchildren.

My work on the railways brought us to Thornbury when I was appointed as Assistant Area Manager, based in Bristol Temple Meads in the late 70's. I took early retirement in 1997. Over subsequent years I felt God encourage me to volunteer in various areas. It was a way I could share my faith in word and action on the 'frontline'.

Initially it was sharing Bible truths in school assemblies with 'Open the Book' then also serving as a School Governor at New

Siblands School. In recent years I have also helped with welcoming, meeting and greeting those in need at Foodbank.

When New Siblands and Culverhill (Yate) schools became Academies I was appointed a Trustee of the overseeing Trust Board, and am now its Chair. The Board oversees the schools' finances, encourages outstanding teaching and learning provision, supports parents / carers and seeks to grow the Special Schools Trust.

Community Mission

We have four Youth Clubs, X Stream Club (school yrs 3 -6) and Ignite Club (school yrs 7-9) are places where our Sunday groups can meet in a Club environment to explore faith and grow supportive friendships and invite their friends along as we introduce them to Jesus. Before pandemic there was a 50/50 split between young people who are part of the Sunday worshipping community and those from the wider community. Basement (school yrs 7-9) and Attic Cafe (school yrs 10-13) are missional community clubs where we provide safe space to grow positive friendships and explore the Christian faith. Before pandemic we had up to 50 young people in Basement and 35 in Attic. All clubs have moved on-line, and, as is the case across the UK, engagement has dropped.
