We all know that Covid has caused havoc and continues to leave a shadow over children, many of whom have fallen behind academically and socially due to lockdown or shielding. It has also exhausted school leaders, teachers and support staff. We desperately need a period of stability and consolidation; for energy to be renewed and routines reestablished.

I used to teach Design & Technology in secondary schools before taking a 5-year break working in catering design.

During furlough I prepared to return to teaching by retraining in Secondary maths and after redundancy, I worked for the

National Tutoring Programme. This month I start a new job as a higher-level teaching assistant for Secondary maths in Bristol.

Local & UK Mission

The Julian Trust Nightshelter for the homeless has been running in Bristol for over 25 years but has been forced to close since the beginning of the first lockdown. Over the past 14 months or so the number of people now living on the streets has risen dramatically. During the lockdowns many were housed in hotels for some time and many have been found accommodation but now the numbers of homeless are rising.

As yet the shelter is still waiting to obtain permission from the council to re-open.

For the last few weeks guests have been able to come in during the evening just for a shower and some sandwiches and also bring in their washing. The numbers are steadily increasing for this service, it began with about 20 guests and is now about 40 plus. This happens during weekday evenings.

Prayer Points:

 Please pray for those who are homeless, for whatever reason, and pray for the opening of the shelter to happen soon. It is often a stepping stone for helping to get people back to some sort of normality.

World Mission

Rock of Ages Prison Ministry –
Constanta Romania: Mircea and
Ronela Cristian report that there is
now some easing of Covid restriction
in Romania but that most of their
engagement with the prisoners
remains online where there have
also been opportunities in new
prisons.

Meanwhile the Bible study correspondence program continues to develop – over the summer 70 new students have enrolled, four have received Jesus in their heart and total students is now 185. And at Easter Rock of Ages provided a New Testament, a letter and some traditional Romanian bread to 3,465 prisoners using the bread as means to talk about the bread of life.

- That more prisoners on the Bible Correspondence course will come to faith.
- For the ongoing battle with bureaucracy making it difficult to work in the prisons.
- For the army of Romanian volunteers that makes the prison ministry possible.
