Local & UK Mission

Beloved is a Bristol-based Christian charity that provides practical and emotional support to women working in city-centre massage parlours and brothels. Practical support includes counselling, assistance with accessing and understanding finance and housing benefits and rights, provision of healthcare support, CV and jobapplication sessions, and multiagency signposting. Beloved also does regular parlour outreach visits and offers emotional and prayer support via face-to-face and phone.

Beloved's aims for the women include reducing isolation and loneliness, improving mental health, providing economic empowerment, reducing barriers to exiting current work, improving personal safety, and increasing sense of wellbeing, selfworth, belonging and friendship

World Mission

Mission partners Mircea & Ronela oversee the Rock of Ages prison ministry in Romania. We have fourteen Ukrainians in the office, five families in fact.

It is a challenge to have them because they have a range of medical and practical help needs.
But we pray to be able to see and to know our God through God's love and care for them.

Concerning the ministry, the pandemic time revealed a great reality, Christians are very focused on themselves and less and less on serving God and serving others and proclaiming the Gospel. We reopened most of the prisons, but the numbers of volunteers involved is much smaller.

Please pray for:

- To be able to go to prison with increasing travel costs. The Bible study must be extended but the cost doubled from the beginning of this year. We could not travel to the churches in the last 2 years.
- A reconnection of Christians with the mission fields.
- A time for encouraging and bringing the coordinators together.
- Winter provisions for prisoners families and for Ukrainians. This will be a hard year with the cost of living.
- · Our health.

World Mission

We are pleased that after an absence of two summers due to COVID the mission with our link church in Transylvania is back this year, between 29 July and 6 August. We are always led by our link church and join in with their mission, working together. This year we will be taking part in Church services in the main town of SzekelyUdvarhely and the village of St Martins on the Sunday but for most of the week we will be leading morning sessions for Children on the topic of "God's Big Story" at a camp in the Transylvania mountainside, and in the afternoon supporting our friends in their activities. Mike (Levy) and Mark (Dale) will be joined on team by four TBC young people - Ben Colwill, Zoe Bonnett, Liberty Lessiter and Bethan Jenkinson, and we would all value your prayers:

- For us as a team as our preparations have been short, that we go with an open heart and a trust in God and that we will grow in our experience of him.
- For our travel, particularly that our flights will take place as planned and that our time at the airport will be smooth.
- Particularly pray for the children who will be in camp, that they will draw close to God in spirit and in heart.
